# FORMAL WRITTEN CRITIQUE (STUDENT WORK)

### **DESCRIPTION**

- Title of Artwork
- Medium
- Measurements of Artwork
- Date Completed
- Hours Spent on the Work
- Factual information (such as "the image is of a child holding a lollipop")

#### **ANALYSIS**

- Use the <u>elements of art</u> and <u>principles of design</u> to write a reflection.
- Be sure to discuss the composition of the work.
- Elements of Art (line, shape, space, form, texture, color, and value)
- Principles of Design (balance, contrast, emphasis, movement, pattern, rhythm, unity, harmony, proportion, and repetition)

#### INTERPRETATION/MEANING

- What is your artwork about?
  - Don't make this up! If your work is an observation drawing, it may not have a "deep" meaning, but you can still talk about what your goals were.
  - For example, "I was interested in drawing a still-life using repetition of form and color to create a whimsical rhythm throughout the piece." Include what/who inspired this work of art.

#### **EVALUATION**

- How good is the artwork?
- Were you successful in accomplishing your desired outcome?
- How are you going to improve the artwork?
- What would you do differently next time?
- What did you learn from this work of art?
