CLARIFYING THE CRITIQUING PROCESS

DO NOW

This activity will help students develop the skills needed to analyze artwork. By breaking down this process by only looking at one <u>element of art</u> and one <u>principle of design</u> at a time, students are able to really look at the artwork and create sentences that fuse the two together.

AGE:

Grades 1 -12

TIME:

5 – 10 minutes

DIRECTIONS:

- ♦ Find someone with a different color post-it.
- ♦ Use the 2 words to create a sentence analyzing Picasso's painting.

MODIFICATIONS:

Try doing the description part of this exercise verbally.

Try moving students around (or rotating around a table) so each student has a chance to work with each other and use all the elements of art and principles of design.



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DO NOW EXAMPLES

- 1. The REPETITION of geometric SHAPES creates HARMONY within the piece.
- 2. The rough TEXTURE of the background adds interest and helps EMPHASIS the figure.
- 3. The COLOR palette adds CONTRAST to the piece.
